The Lyceum Scholars Academic Program is America's first and only university-based academic program dedicated to exploring the moral, political, and economic foundations of a free society.

Drawing inspiration from the Lyceum School founded by Aristotle in 335 BC Athens, we have created a philosophically oriented and intellectually integrated academic program that presents students with ideas that are fundamental, timeless, and life-changing.

The professors of the Lyceum Scholar Program create a philosophic community based on a classical form of education patterned after Socrates' apprenticeship model. All incoming Lyceum freshmen will be placed in a small *learning community* and a faculty "Socratic tutor" will closely monitor and guide their intellectual development for their entire four-year education.

Selection Process

Each year, a small group of students will be selected to participate in the Lyceum Scholars Program.

Those interested in becoming Lyceum Scholars should apply in their senior year of high school to Clemson University and to the CISC Lyceum Scholars Program.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

All Lyceum Scholars take an 8-course sequence with at least one Lyceum course each semester, and take all of their program courses together as an intellectual cohort.
