Our academic programs in Oxford, Cambridge, and New York, offer students the chance to challenge themselves intellectually in traditional disciplines such as Art History, Literature, Politics and Economics, Drama, Creative Writing, and Speech and Debate as well as in subjects that are less commonly offered to school-age students, such as Global Medicine, International Law, Business and Finance, Architecture, or Filmmaking.

Our programs in Barcelona and Paris offer intensive Spanish and French language classes at all levels – from beginner to advanced and even fluent. They also offer academic courses in Spanish and French, such as *Cultura y cocina*, *Barcelona y la cultura moderna*, *Barcelona: Taller literario*, *Littérature française*, *Sciences politiques*, and *Le Bien et le Mal*, not to mention a wide array of academic and creative courses in English.

By contrast, our programs in Montpellier, *L'Académie de France*, and in Salamanca, *La Academia de España*, are complete immersion, catering to students whose aim is to improve their spoken and written language by communicating exclusively in French or Spanish throughout their time on the program. Students must have already completed at least two years of French or Spanish in school, and may sign up for a variety of courses focusing on a wide range of themes (from cinema and cuisine to international relations and medicine), all of which are geared toward improving language skills. All communication takes place in the local language, and students are expected to speak French or Spanish every day at all times.
